

ach year, the Newport Beach Public Library welcomes more than one million visitors to the Central Library and to its three neighborhood branches – along with an additional half a million visitors to the eBranch at www.newportbeachlibrary.org. Not just books, the library provides engaging and enlightening programs for all ages, as well as a place to study, learn, meet, explore, and grow.

Who and what makes the Library possible? It's a collaboration — a public and private partnership.



The public side of that partnership shows our tax dollars at work.
And the private side? That's where The Newport Beach Public Library Foundation comes in. The Foundation provides funding that allows the Library to go far and above what a normal library is able

to offer. Programs such as the incredibly popular Witte Lecture Series, Library Live, writing and financial workshops, as well as modern tech offerings, such as the media lab, sound lab, early literacy workstations, and more.

This seamless partnership provides a strategy superior to one that is wholly public or wholly private — and allows each to do what it does best. For the Library, that means identifying collections and resources that benefit the community, managing those assets with care, and maintaining and nurturing an organization that the public will support. For the Foundation, that means raising funds to provide critical financial support for the Library, presenting outstanding programming in the form of speaker series, seminars, workshops and events, with the community as the beneficiary of this unique collaboration.

Since 1997, the Newport Beach Public Library Foundation has raised and contributed more than \$4.3 million to the Newport Beach Public Library system. The Foundation supplements the materials budget with an average annual gift of \$220,000 — funds that play an important role in the Library's success. Without the support of the Foundation, this high level of public service would have been difficult to achieve.

For more than a quarter of a century, the Newport Beach Public Library has been one of the city's most valued assets, one that sustains and improves the quality of life in Newport Beach, and one that could not have been achieved without a strong Foundation.



February 8 & 9, 2019

Richard Blanco is the fifth presidential inaugural poet and the first Latino immigrant and gay person to serve in such a role. He is the author of numerous award-winning works such as *The Prince of Los Cocuyos:* A Miami Childhood and An Inaugural Poet's Journey. Blanco is the recipient of three honorary doctorates and has been a guest on numerous television programs as well as NPR. Born in Madrid to Cuban-



exiled parents and raised in Miami, the themes of his books center on the negotiation of cultural identity and place in society. Whether speaking as the Cuban Blanco or the American Richard, the homebody or the world traveler, the civil engineer or the civic-minded poet, Blanco's writings possess a story-rich quality that illuminates the human spirit. His work asks those universal questions we all ask ourselves on our own journeys: Where am I from? Where do I belong? Who am I in this world? We welcome Mr. Blanco to our series.



joel sartore

April 12 &13, 2019

Joel Sartore is an award-winning photographer, speaker, author, conservationist, the 2018 National Geographic Explorer of the Year, and a regular contributor to *National Geographic Magazine*. Sartore specializes in documenting endangered species and landscapes around the world. He is the founder of the *Photo Ark*, a 25-year



documentary project to save species and habitats. "It is folly to think that we can destroy one species and ecosystem after another and not affect humanity," he says. "When we save species, we're actually saving ourselves." Sartore and the Photo Ark are the subjects of the television series RARE, in which he documents some of the most endangered creatures left on Earth. In addition to National Geographic, Joel contributes to Audubon, Geo, The New York Times, and Smithsonian. He has authored several books, including Photo Ark: A World Worth Saving, and RARE: Portraits of America's Endangered Species.






rachel devlin

In the years before the Supreme Court struck down school segregation with its 1954 Brown v. Board of Education decision, the struggle to desegregate America's schools was a grassroots movement, and young women were on the front lines. As early as the 1940's, parents and young girls were filing desegregation lawsuits. Author Rachel Devlin's research transforms our understanding of one of the twentieth century's most important civil rights battles, set in motion by undaunted students. After years spent researching these remarkable women, she brings to us their powerful stories of leadership, bravery and a steely resolve to gain civil rights. Devlin reminds us of the courage and sacrifice they endured and how relevant their struggle remains today.

writing the truth of our lives

Have you ever wished you knew more about your grandparents' lives? Have you ever wondered about the people, places, and events that shaped them? Or their childhood homes and the loved ones who filled them? Have you ever wished you could bring their days gone by to life again? If so, the library's memoir writing workshop is probably for you.

"The art of writing a memoir is a great equalizer," according to Jean Hastings Ardell, NBPLF Memoir Writing Workshop Director. "Each individual is the author of his or her own life, each possesses the authority and expertise to give an account of that life."

Over the past decade of teaching the memoir writing workshop for the Foundation, a few things have become apparent to Jean. "First, there are no ordinary lives, and consequently, no ordinary stories. Second, our library and its Foundation attract an extraordinary variety of people.

The six-week workshop addresses the complexities of what to do when you can't recall the details of long-ago childhood, as well as the telling of family anecdotes. Also discussed are literary techniques, such as creating a sense of place, the use of dialogue and inner dialogue, and the inclusion of lists, letters, certificates, report cards, immigration papers, and other items that can enhance our narratives.

The Fall 2018 series will run Tuesdays from September 25th through October 30th, 5:30-8:30pm. A second series will begin in January 2019. The NBPLF website will open registration for this winter series in November.
