tim hetherton appointed library services director

The Board of Library Trustees recently announced the appointment of Tim Hetherton as Library Services Director. With nearly twenty years of experience in library services along with a thoroughly modern perspective. Tim is highly qualified to lead the library into its next chapter. So what can we expect? His answers to some of our questions are below.

How do you see libraries evolving over the next 5-10 years?

I see libraries providing what they have always provided - cultural enrichment, self-directed learning. curriculum support, programs. recreational reading. But I also baliava that successful libraries will transition themselves into community centers or "recreation centers for your brain" as one our staff members so aptly described them. Libraries will broaden the impact they have on their communities by offering amenities such as digital studios for creative work, space for programs, meeting rooms, comfortable areas for reading and studying and interior design that is welcoming and functional. Libraries have to align their services to what their users need. For example technological and information literacy are essential skills now, and their importance will only increase in the future. Librarians will need to transition from answering reference questions to teaching customers to navigate new technologies as they emerge.

What is the biggest challenge libraries face today?

Promoting the value of public libraries is the biggest challenge we are facing. We do a good job of marketing our resources and services to people who already use and love us, but the challenge is to reach the people we

aren't reaching. We need to let neonle know what they are missing

What is your biggest focus right now? I am focusing on the Cultural Arts

Are you an ebook, paperback or hardcover reader?

I like hard covers, but I also enjoy reading eMagazines from Zinio on a tablet or iPhone

How do you motivate your kids to read and/or instill a love of reading in them?

I think it is a matter of matching their interests to the appropriate literature. My ten-year old son was a reluctant reader in 1st grade. He was interested in football so I got him some football cards. He was fascinated with them and basically learned to read from the back of football cards. I think he realized on some level that he was missing part of a very large world by not reading. He is now a voracious reader and is now much more interested in reading than he is in football. My wife and I both read to all three of our children when they were little, and it was such a nice bonding

experience that I am sure they equate enjoying a book with being loved.

How do you feel we can help to keep libraries relevant in this electronic age?

Libraries will stay relevant if they go where the customers are going. That means embracing technology as a means to deliver what we have always delivered: great service, curriculum support, quality materials in quantities that satisfy demand, programs that engage our users and draw new users into the library. It also means that we have to communicate the value of libraries, that we make people's lives better and that we bring joy to the lives of our customers.
