

Libraries Transform Communities; You Transform Libraries

ecently I met a grad student in a UC Irvine Ph.D. program working on her dissertation here at the Central Library. Her husband, also a student, was spending some time in the Children's Area with their young child. Mom and Dad take turns studying and watching the little one. Parents have a quiet, supportive space to work toward their degrees. Child develops a love for books and the library where the imagination is nurtured in a space devoid of advertising and unnecessary distraction. Where else could this possibly happen? And happen for free.

I am often inspired when I have the opportunity to chat with a library customer; what I hear confirms that there is at least one place in society that continues to work for everyone who has the desire to use it.

Municipal dollars fund the library system and private dollars enable it to stay modern and offer valuable programs. Some of us contribute with tax dollars and others contribute by becoming members of the Library Foundation. Many of you do both. The entire community is a beneficiary. And that community extends far beyond the city limits.

Andrew Carnegie understood this and used his great good fortune to transform communities through the public library.

"It was from my own early experience that I decided there was no use to which money could be applied so productive... as the founding of a public library."

Carnegie's words illustrate the Library Foundation's *raison d'etre*. Our members make it possible. Library Journal Gives the Library a Star Rating

The Library Journal (LJ) is an American trade publication for librarians. Founded in 1876, it reports news about the library world, mostly public libraries. Why is a "star rating" a big deal? The LJ Index is based on five types of per capita use libraries generate: visits, circulation, e-circulation, public access computer use and program attendance. Star Library ratings of five, four and three stars are awarded to libraries that generate the highest combined per capita outputs among their spending peers. In 2016, there were only 260 "Star Libraries" in the U.S. and NBPL was one! That means your library has collections, technology, online resources and programs that rank highly in comparison to other libraries.


